Staff have just completed their NEP's with parents and students are now ensured that each child has the chance to develop their potential within. It's great to see all students utilising the full range of curriculum available from the outside learning areas, the horticulture areas to the hall and the gym. We continue to look closely at our future. We are currently working through projected vacancies for 2017 through the movement of students across all sub schools. This includes the Annex class where we continue to look for suitable students to move there if they fit the placement criteria. We have had 3 students exit the school this, one a family moved to the country and the other, a vacancy came up in a private setting. We have had a new student enter the S3 class, his name is Nawfie, and we would like to welcome him and his family to the school community.

The Junior class had a visit from a "tame" Koala during week 4. The students were very kind and gentle to him and really enjoyed experiencing one of Australia's moved loved animals in real life.

A number of students attended the Focus on Ability" short film festival. Our school was involved in making one of these short films in 2015 and it focuses on recognising students with a disability. It was very successful and the students got a lot out of it.

We rolled out a new reporting system for student accident and injury this year, which both staff and parents/carers have supported greatly. All accidents/injuries now require an immediate phone call to the parent/carer and appropriate documentation recorded within the school from staff. This ensures and promotes a strong culture of parent/school communication and a comprehensive documentation of any accidents and injuries.

Could I ask all parents/carers to continually check your child's hair for head lice. It is easily spread and requires not only your child's hair to be washed, but the washing of all linen that the child accesses at home. Please refer to the information brochure that was sent out last term with methods to use to best treat lice. If you require further information, please contact the school.

Finally, could I ask that parents and carers utilize the "U" turn at the end of our driveway during drop off and pick up times, rather than turning at your child's respective sub-school, please also be mindful that we students who will run into traffic; it would be greatly appreciated if you could maintain the 10km speed limit whilst in the drive way. This will ensure safety and good traffic flow during these times.

Well done to the M3 class on their outstanding efforts.



Junior Primary Term 2




We have all started back this term bright and eager to learn in the junior school.


What has been happening in the Primary Unit?
