It has affected the school staff significantly, but what I can say is that I was proud of collegiality, thoughtfulness and support that all staff provided upon hearing this news. Staff continue to be supported through counselling at this difficult time. Teachers have been working with the SWISS (Social Work Incident Support Service) counsellors around managing the grief with students through appropriate teaching, communication and support strategies. On behalf of the school community in its entirety, I wish to pass on my condolences to Scott's family and friends.

A focus of the day will be around assessment reporting, in particular a program they have been trialling called ABLES. We look forward to their expertise and insight with this new reporting system.

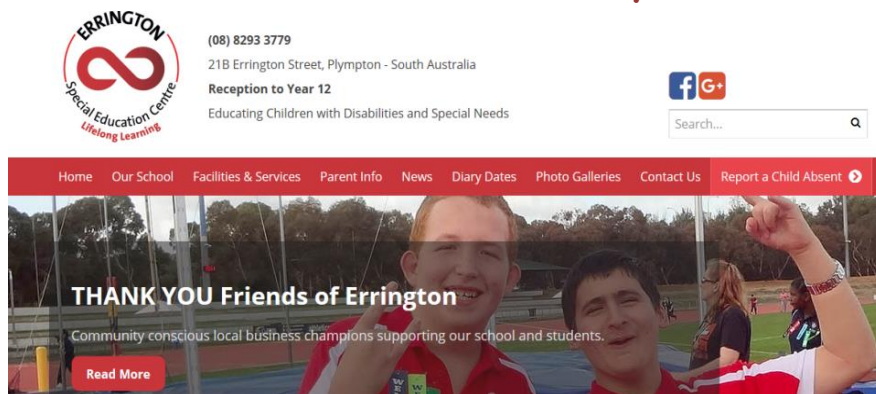

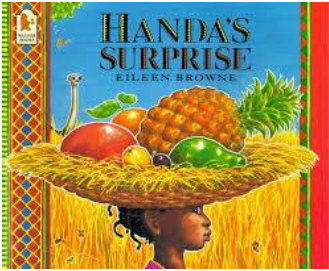

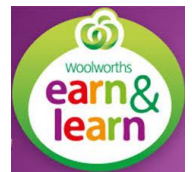
Junior Primary

Busy Bees Class



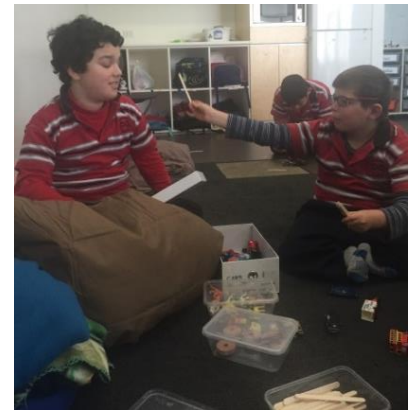

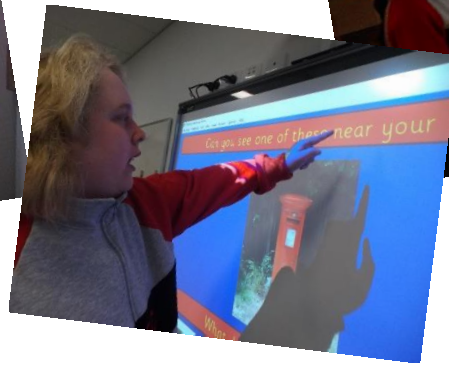
