


Give descriptions	this is big, that is little, that one is bigger, this one is the biggest






1. Use grammar supports to model that > those, this> these





### IDEAS FOR USING 'THIS' & 'THAT'

- 2. Work on opposites to describe objects: THIS is wet, THAT is dry, THIS is clean, THAT is dirty, THIS is big, THAT is little, etc.
- 3. Nursery Rhyme: "This old man", "This little piggy"
- 4. During craft activities, give directions as you are making, e.g. Put it on THIS one, put it on THAT one, get THAT one, get one like THIS, etc.
- 5. Type "THIS/THAT" into a google image search, for lots of fill in the blank grammar worksheets for this and that.
- 6. THIS & THAT is a highly functional pronoun that can stand in the place of nouns in many activities. This allows you to model language on the home page, without having to navigate to fringe folders. You could model "I like cake", but staying on the home page you could also simply model "I like that" (and perhaps pointing to the cake picture in the magazine).
